International Ministries Still Needs Your Help!

Dr. Steve James, an International Ministries (IM) missionary doctor, recently returned to his home in the north of Haiti after leading a four-person medical team that worked for eight days near the epicenter of the 7.0 earthquake.

These efforts included time at the Haiti Health Ministries Christianville Clinic. Although the Christianville staff's homes and the clinic were destroyed, they worked for 30 hours non-stop through the night of the earthquake, giving primary medical care to hundreds of injured people that appeared in the front yard. On January 14, Steve and his team took over care of the wounded that continued to come every day, freeing the local staff to organize, salvage and move medical supplies and equipment out of the damaged clinic and set up a makeshift clinic in a nearby undamaged school building.
